All classes are own choice pieces. Please indicate on the entry form whether or not you require a Festival Accompanist. Where a Festival Accompanist is required please send full details of the piece and the instrument and a clearly legible hard copy of the accompaniment to Sue Ogden, 79 Brockholes Lane, Holmfirth HD9 7EB by the closing date for entries, 7th July 2025. You must bring on the day a further copy of the music for the Adjudicator marked clearly with:

- * the name of the performer/ensemble
- * the class number
- * the title(s) and composers(s) of the piece(s)

Please note that digital copies cannot be accepted.

If any piece is not identified or it does not conform with the class rules, then the performer/ensemble may perform in the class and will receive verbal and written feedback but will not be placed first, second or third in the class.

You may not play the same piece in more than one class in the festival unless a final.

Piano Classes 12-21:

All piano classes for 2025 will involve own choice pieces for the first time. A **legible hard** copy of the piece for the Adjudicator must be brought on the day clearly marked with:
